## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO A REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION

<u>If you have a disability</u> and a change of rules, policy, or procedure would help you to live on one of the properties, use the facilities, or take part in an on-site program, you can ask for a change. Those changes are called a Reasonable Accommodation (defined further below).

If you can show that you have a disability, and if your request is reasonable, not too expensive, or difficult to arrange, we will try to make the change you request.

Reasonable Accommodation further defined:

1. <u>A "reasonable accommodation" is a change in rules, policies or practices or a change in the way services are provided. With a few exceptions, the Fair Housing Act (FHA), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act, and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) require landlords to grant reasonable accommodations in order to enable a person with a disability to have an equal opportunity to use and enjoy a dwelling unit or any of a development's public areas</u>
